Work Life Balance

I thought I'd share a concerning trend with the increasing number of instances where school staff are being contacted after hours with work related issues.

Like everyone, the staff have the right to be able to spend time away from work without it being imposed on them. Many of the instances being reported to

me don't appear urgent in nature and involve contact with staff after school hours and on their personal phones.

Staff are on duty from 8:20 am each morning through to 4:20pm on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and 3:20pm on Thursdays and Fridays. The Front Office is attended Monday to Friday from 8:20 am to 4:20 pm. We also have Compass and email options available for non-urgent communication and the phone system has an answering machine to leave messages.

For wellbeing related concerns, we have at least one Wellbeing Team member available each school day and a dedicated wellbeing mobile phone for families to contact the Wellbeing Team directly. If you wish to have the Wellbeing Team mobile number please leave a message at the Front Office and a team member will call you back. This phone will be managed by the team member on duty, on the day. If you are unable to contact the wellbeing team member on duty via the wellbeing mobile please, contact the Front Office.

If you have other concerns, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance if it is related to a particular class or the appropriate Unit Leader. Our Unit Leaders are Ron Schauer (Foundation to Year Coffey (Years 10, 11 and 12).

For student absences please enter them on Compass or contact the Front Office staff who enter


YEAR 8 & 9 PARENTS/CARERS

Whats happening in Humanities?

Foundation students have been learning about the Dream Time Story of $\mathsf{T}iddalik$ the Frog in Humanities.

Why is Tiddalick the frog important to Aboriginal culture?

The story of Tiddalik the Frog teaches children about the importance of generosity and of sharing what you have access to. It shows them how being greedy is bad and about the consequences of their actions. After reading the story of Tiddalik, the Foundation students made their noisy frogs.



In Grade 3 & 4 Humanities, students are learning about the 'talking stick'. According to tradition, in many indigenous cultures a 'talking stick' was used to facilitate just and fair council meetings. The common understanding was that the person holding the 'talking stick' was the one with the right to speak and when passed to a new person, the stick would empower them with their voice and right words to contribute. The focus was on listening and waiting to share. Students then constructed a Talking Stick either of a Man or Woman from natural materials.

HAVE YOU CHECKED YET?

Parents need to monitor their child's hair weekly as Headlice are very active critters and can move in at any time, they can lay over 50 eggs in the span of a week. Within 7-10 days these eggs hatch and new hatchlings are capable of laying eggs themselves within 18 days.

Checking and treating headlice is a parent's responsibility not the schools, however we are happy to give advice and demonstrate the correct technique for detecting and treating headlice.

If you detect headlice in your child you are obligated to notify the school and to keep your child home until you have started treating the headlice. A completed *Notification of Treatment* form should accompany your child's return to school.

Remember that once headlice are detected, your child's hair requires treating every 7 days for 3 weeks to completely eradicate Headlice, as the treatment solution doesn't kill the eggs which will hatch after 7 days. It takes 16 days for the newly hatched lice to turn into an egg laying adult.

If you are experiencing financial difficulty and need to treat headlice please contact the school to explore avenues of help.
