Now with two weeks to go until the School Survey closes for Parents, Carers and Guardians we have responses from only half of our families. Unless we achieve higher than a 75% response rate, it will be difficult to clearly determine if we have a fair representation of opinions from our families. The principal position at Tyrrell College is being advertised and applications close on Wednesday 30 August.

High Achievers Recognised

A sincere congratulations to the seven students who have been selected to participate in the VHAP (Victorian High Ability Program). Aria Leo and Finn Austerberry will participate in the Junior English and Junior Mathematics program, respectively. Mia Austerberry and Phoebe Bailey will join the Secondary English cohort and Darcey Hodgson, Ben Barbary and Cooper Kelly are part of the Secondary Mathematics program. The VHAP has given nearly 48,000 high-ability students from Grade 5 to Year 8 the chance to take part in online extension and enrichment programs in English and Mathematics up to the end of 2022. Between Term 1, 2023, and Term 4, 2025, a further 57,000 places will be available to students.

The students were identified by the Department from their 2023 NAPLAN results. Well done to all of you!

State NAPLAN Results

We now have the state and national data from the 2023 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assessments. On this measure, the results Victorian schools have achieved are nothing short of extraordinary. Of the 20 tests across Grades 3 and 5 and Years 7 and 9, Victorian ranked first or second in 16, more than any other state or territory, and an improvement on the 2022 results when the equivalent figure was 12.

In secondary schools, Victoria has the lowest proportion of students needing additional support in both Years 7 and 9 in both reading and numeracy compared to all other states and territories.

Victoria's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students achieved the highest mean scores in both reading and writing in Grade 3 and Years 7 and 9, compared to Aboriginal students in other jurisdictions.

Victoria's disadvantaged students achieved the highest mean scores in 19 of 20 measures compared to disadvantaged students in other jurisdictions.

Tyrrell College NAPLAN Results

Our students have also performed extremely well in this year's NAPLAN assessment. While we'd like 100% of our students achieving at the Strong or Exceeding level, it is reassuring that, overall, we are performing better than similar schools in Reading and Numeracy. For Reading we had a 97.75% participation rate for all year levels combined, with 62.5% of primary students and 66.5% of secondary students achieving Strong or Exceeding. For Numeracy, we had a 96.25% participation rate for all participating year levels, with 81.25% of primary students and 72% of secondary students achieving Strong or Exceeding. In Writing, we once again had a 97.75% participation rate, with 50% of primary students and a lower 45% of secondary students achieving Strong or Exceeding. As a team we will further investigate this data to identify our focus for next vear.



HAVE YOU CHECKED YET?

Parents need to monitor their child's hair weekly as Headlice are very active critters and can move in at any time, they can lay over 50 eggs in the span of a week. Within 7-10 days these eggs hatch and new hatchlings are capable of laying eggs themselves within 18 days.

If anyone would like to know how to conduct the "conditioner comb through" checking method, please don't hesitate to contact me at school Tue. Wed. Thur Ph: (03) 50702106.

Checking and treating headlice is a parent's responsibility not the schools, however we are happy to give advice and demonstrate the correct technique for detecting and treating headlice.

If you detect headlice in your child you are obligated to notify the school and to keep your child home until you have started treating the headlice. A completed *Notification of Treatment* form should accompany your child's return to school.

Remember that once headlice are detected, your child's hair requires treating every 7 days for 3 weeks to completely eradicate Headlice, as the treatment solution doesn't kill the eggs which will hatch after 7 days. It takes 16 days for the newly hatched lice to turn into an egg laying adult.

If you are experiencing financial difficulty and need to treat headlice please contact the school to explore avenues of help.
