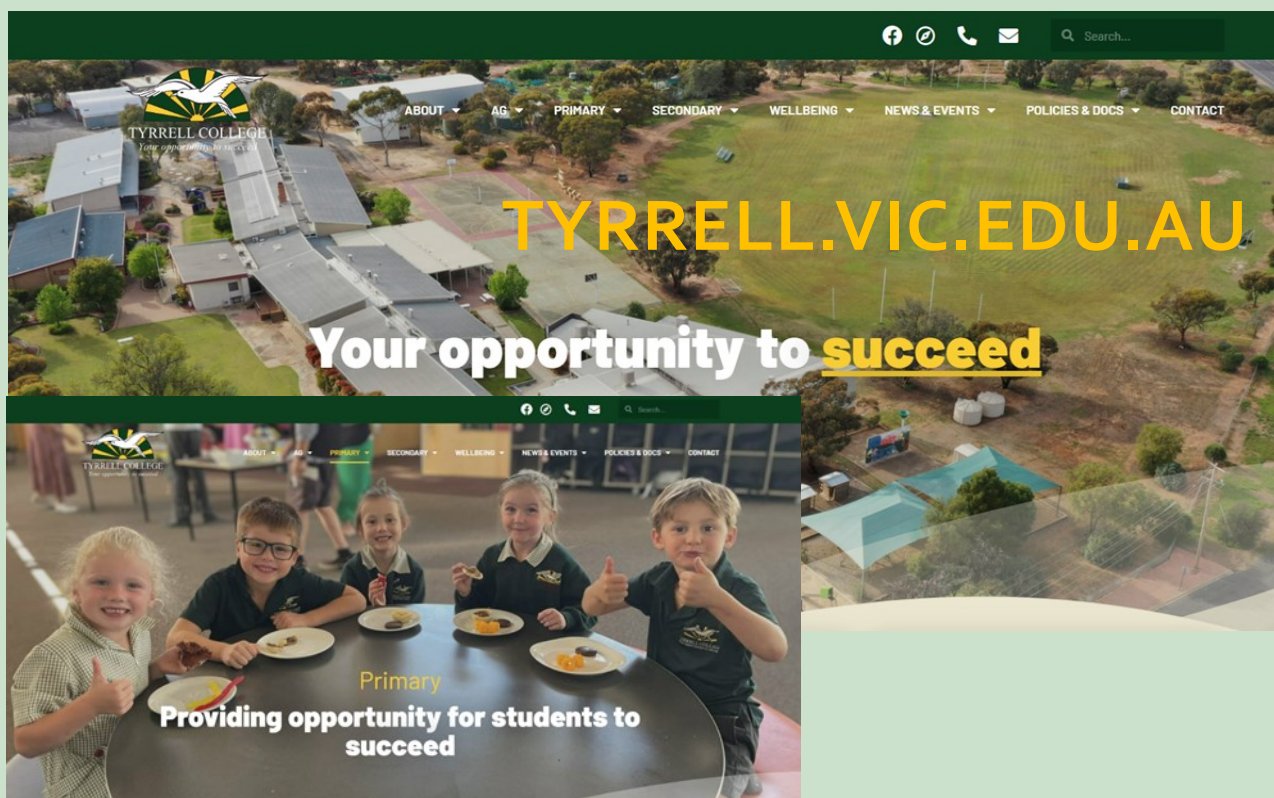

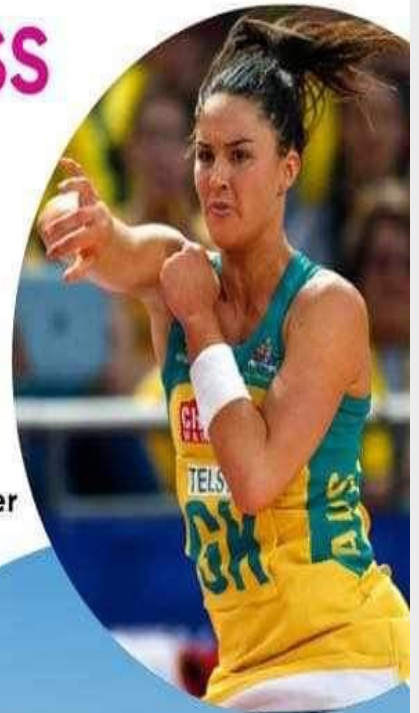

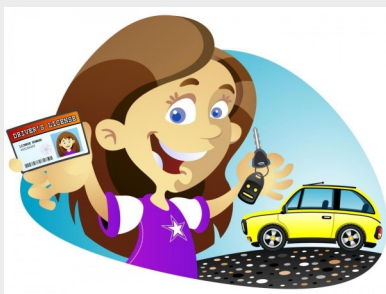
Need help getting your P's?

Be Sun Smart in Term 4

With the coming of Term 4 our Sunsmart Policy comes into action. This means School Bucket hats need to be worn at all times when outdoors and are part of the school uniform and are in our school color of green. If you don't currently have a bucket hat please contact the Front Office to arrange one. Cost is \$15 and they are embroidered with your child's name to prevent them from becoming lost. Baseball/peak caps are not suitable. Sunscreen is supplied by the school for outside activities (current supply is Nivea and Pharmacy's own brand but can vary to other brands)



If your child has an allergy or sensitivity to any sunscreens you are welcome to supply some of a brand of your own choosing to be kept at school for your child exclusive use. If sending in an individual supply for your child, please label clearly and put a note in your child's diary or ring the front office to let staff know so it can be noted.



HEADLICE



Remember that school holidays are a peak time for headlice to visit, when children come into close contact with others and when travelling for holidays and meeting new people.

Please remember to do a headlice check on your child's hair.

Headlice are very active critters and can move in at anytime, they can lay over 50 eggs in the span of a week. Within 7-10 days these eggs hatch and new hatchlings are capable of laying eggs themselves within 16 days. So you can see why regular



checking is recommended, don't wait until you notice your child scratching their head (not all children will scratch) but if they are please investigate and stay vigilant. If you need help or want more information about detecting and treating headlice, please don't hesitate to contact Carol Elliott (sec school nurse) at the school.
