### Dear Students and Families,

### NAPLAN Time!

It's that time of year again when the NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy) is conducted across all schools in Australia. Once again, it is being held in March so that schools have access to the results earlier.

Each year, there is some debate and discussion around the assessment program. For me, NAPLAN provides our school with valuable externally assessed data to compare against our own internal assessments and information, both to gauge our performance against similar schools and to identify how best to meet the needs of our students.

NAPLAN data is quite often used by the Federal and State education departments to identify students and schools for additional funding opportunities, which support at risk and high achieving students.

I encourage all students in Years Three, Five, Seven and Nine to participate and do their best, as the student and school results are used to identify students for the VHAP (Victorian High Ability Program), the MYLYNS (Middle Years Literacy Numeracy Strategy), and other programs or initiatives that provide additional resources to support your child's learning.

At Tyrrell College, we make every effort to ensure we have 100% of our students participating in all assessments and with their best effort. Last year, we had almost 100% participation in all assessments, except for one Year 7 student missing three tests and a Year 9 student not completing any tests.

Last year, our school performed better than similar schools in three of the four year levels for Reading and better than similar schools and the state average in Numeracy in all year levels.

### International Women's Day

Today we celebrate all of the amazing women who have helped, led and encouraged us in our lives. I still vividly remember the female teachers who made an impression on me as a young person and the inspiration they provided in valuing education. Please be generous in your praise to those who have been a catalyst to you aspiring to be your best. 



# COVID-19

Covid is still active widely across Victorian communities. While isolation is no longer a legal requirement the following is the Dept of Education recommendation Management of COVID-19 in schools

It is recommended that staff members, students or visitors who have symptoms of cold, influenza or COVID-19 undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of symptomatic students should be asked to collect their child from school and keep them home until they are no longer symptomatic.

The Department of Health recommends that staff and students who test positive for COVID-19 isolate for a minimum of 5 days and do not attend school until their symptoms resolve. If well enough, students should be supported in the same way as students with an extended absence due to illness or injury, with learning material provided to support their continued learning.

The Department of Health also recommends that masks should be worn by a person who:

1. is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home

has COVID-19 for at least 7 days after a positive test when they need to leave home.

If families need assistance with face masks please contact your schools.






High calibre circus, a rocking soundtrack, and genuine belly laughs propelled the Australian debut of Children are Stinky to Sell-Out seasons across the world.
