# VCE Ag/Hort Farm Excursions

On Thursday March 13 our Ag and Hort class went on an excursion to the Kelly's piggery. This was part of our area of study, intensive farming, so the Kelly's farm was a golden opportunity. Their farm is part of a farrow to finish, which includes all phases of breeding pigs. We got to see all the stages of production, breeding, gestation, farrowing, lactation, weening, and then growing the pigs to market weight. Some of the highlights were seeing the old farrowing sheds compared to the newer more advanced shed and the technology they use.

After lunch we headed out to John (Bull) Clohesys feedlot to be shown the stages that the lambs need to go through until they are heavy enough to be sold at market. They start the new lambs on a normal feed but add a special additive to the water to settle the lambs stomachs while they get used to the feed and lowers the stress. John has said that this has been a gamechanger, lowering the mortality rate unbelievably. As the lambs gain weight, they move them from one pen to another increasing the amount of protein and energy in their diet until they're ready to be sold. We found that the purpose of intensive farming and feed lotting was to increase the production of livestock in a more efficient and shorter amount of time.

We would like to thank Miss Matthews for organising the excursion and to John Clohesy and the Kelly family for taking time out of their day to show us around their farms.

In Term 2 we have a focus on "Being Healthy"

With planned visits from **"The Smile Squad" team who are a Government funded team of dentists**. The Sea Lake team will be provided by the Royal Flying Doctor Service. This is a free service, with parental consent, for all students. The Smile Squad will be here from **Monday April 28 to May 2** conducting student dental examinations and will return May 12-16 to carry out any treatments required. ALL that is required is for parents to **scan the QR code or press on the link on the Smile Squad page below and complete the consent form**, however if you would prefer a paper consent form please contact the Front Office to arrange for a copy to be sent home or completed at school. Please note this preliminary visit in April is a free dental health check for all students whether under private dental care or not. No treatment will take place until the return visit in May.

**Wednesday April 30** we will also receive a visit from **Blue Star Eyecare** who are Government funded to provide **free vision assessments** for all Foundation to Year 3 students. This is the first time this service has been made available to Tyrrell College and it is a welcome addition to our students learning journey. **More information is to come.** 

I would encourage all parents to participate in these free services by fully qualified practitioners who will be coming to us, instead of having to travel long distances for similar services. All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) will soon receive a free oral health pack to bring home. The pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

#### Standard strength toothpaste-


Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional. If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use. **Do I need to attend my child's appointment?** 

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.


