Student Reflections: Darwin WW2

Tom Irwin: What surprised me most was the sheer scale of the bombings of Darwin, and how devastating they were. Prior to this trip, I knew that Darwin had been bombed, but I only thought that it was a couple of buildings or something, not that most of Darwin was destroyed. I was also shocked that Australia didn't really do much about it, or even try to defend it, even after the war. I think people don't generally know this because it just isn't really covered in the education system, and it isn't considered to be a big thing in the scheme of the war. I think that most people know that it happened, just not how bad it was.

Jenna Alday: While learning about the bombing of Darwin I was shocked with the extent of the bombing and destruction as well as the unpreparedness of Australia despite considerable anticipation. I found it interesting how Darwin was left in wreckage for so long after the war with so many squatters in the ruins.

Dayna McKenzie: During our visit to Darwin, I enjoyed the tour in the truck while taking in a lot of new information, it was a good way to explore without overheating whilst developing our understanding of war impact in Darwin.

Darcey Hodgson: While in Darwin we visited the Darwin Wartime Experience, where we were able to drive around the beautiful city of Darwin and have a look at some wartime memorabilia. I had never realised the devastating impacts that the war had on Darwin and being able to read and listen to what they experienced really opened my eyes. After this experience I am still unsure why this horrific part of history isn't talked about more often, it has shaped the lives of so many residents of the Northern Territory and should be a well known part of Australian history. My highlight of our trip to Darwin was the Litchfield National Park, where we got to swim in waterfalls and experience the native wildlife.

Being HEALTHY

In Term 2 we have a focus on "Being Healthy"

With planned visits from "The Smile Squad" team who are a Government funded team of dentists. The Sea Lake team will be provided by the Royal Flying Doctor Service. This is a free service, with parental consent, for all students. The Smile Squad will be here from Monday April 28 to May 2 conducting student dental examinations and will return May 12-16 to carry out any treatments required. ALL that is required is for parents to scan the QR code or press on the link on the Smile Squad page below and complete the consent form, however if you would prefer a paper consent form please contact the Front Office to arrange for a copy to be sent home or completed at school. Please note this preliminary visit in April is a free dental health check for all students whether under private dental care or not. No treatment will take place until the return visit in May.

Wednesday, July 30 (NOTE CHANGE OF DATE) we will also receive a visit from Blue Star Eyecare who are Government funded to provide free vision assessments for all Foundation to Year 3 students. This is the first time this service has been made available to Tyrrell College and it is a welcome addition to our students learning journey. More information is to come.

I would encourage all parents to participate in these free services by fully qualified practitioners who will be coming to us, instead of having to travel long distances for similar services. Consent forms are as simple as a QR code scan or call the office at Tyrrell College ph 50702106 if you need assistance or would like to know more.

Dear Tyrrell College families,

The Smile Squad Team are looking forward to arriving Monday to set up, the team will have some paper consents for parents/guardians that prefer to sign up this way, as well as a laminated QR code poster for easy online sign up.

The Smile Squad team from RFDS are coming to our school soon. Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program. This means ALL students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school. Monday April 28 to Friday May 2, Monday May 12 to Friday May 16. How to access free dental care? We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian. Sign up to Smile Squad at:

Smile Squad oral health packs- All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens. Your child(ren) will soon receive a free oral health pack to bring home. The pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Standard strength toothpaste- Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional. If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment? No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

The RFDS Smile Squad look forward to seeing you soon.


