#### School Review

#### School for Student Leadership

Our students, along with the other schools involved, presented their Community Leadership Project, that they will undertake once they return to school.

#### CSEF (Camps, Sports, and Excursions Fund) Funding Reminder:

2025 Applications for CSEF close on 4 July, if you are a holder of a Health Care Card, your child may be eligible for CSEF Funding. Eligible Primary students receive \$154 and Secondary students \$256. The CSEF provides payments to assist eligible families to cover the costs of camps, sporting activities, excursions and incursions. Payments are made directly to an eligible student's school. Schools must use a CSEF payment only for the eligible student or for that student's siblings. If you have a current Health Care Card, please provide a copy to the Front Office or contact them on (03 5070 2106) no later than the 1st July to allow time to process.

The North Central Trade Training Centre (NCTTC) provides start-of-theart vocational educational and training facilities to meet the needs of students in Years 10 to 12.

Based in Charlton, the NCTTC is a partnership of nine local schools (Boort District School, Charlton P-12 College, Donald High School, East Loddon P-12, Pyramid Hill P-10 College, St. Arnaud Secondary College, Tyrrell College, Wedderburn P-12 College and Wycheproof P-12 College).


The Centre provides specialised vocational education and training in the fields of agriculture, animal studies, automotive, building & construction, engineering, hair, beauty, community services, health, hospitality, music, and sport & recreation. The students had a very educational day, meeting teachers and trainers and participating in information sessions. This will further support their subject selection process in Term 3.


