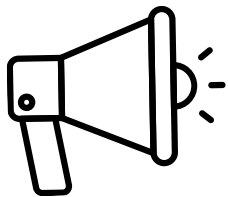

Year 11 and 12 final year PT interviews were held, offering feedback to the students, and the 2026 Subject Selection booklets were distributed.

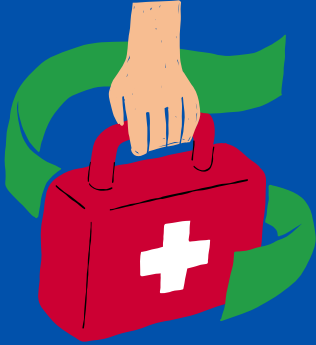

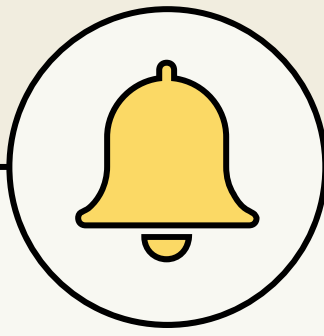

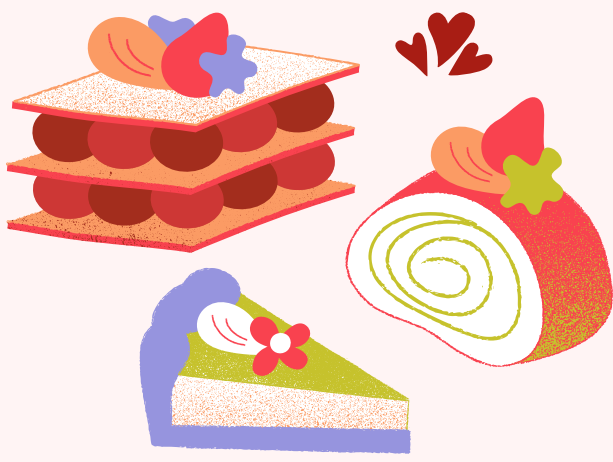

The School Wide Positive Behaviour program encourages positive learning and behaviour from all students through an acknowledgment system.
