YEAR 7 HUMANITIES-BARK PAINTING



#### Students Connect with Country Through Traditional Aboriginal Bark Painting-

Year 7 students embarked on an incredible journey of cultural discovery through the ancient art of Aboriginal bark painting, creating beautiful artworks while learning about one of Australia's oldest artistic traditions. The project began with students venturing around our school grounds to collect pieces of bark, connecting them directly with the natural materials that Aboriginal artists have used for thousands of years. This hands-on approach helped students understand the deep relationship between Aboriginal culture and the Australian landscape. Once back in the classroom, students carefully prepared their bark canvases using traditional methods. They soaked the bark in lukewarm water to make it more pliable, then pressed it flat to create the perfect surface for their artwork. This preparation process taught students the importance of patience and respect for natural materials in Aboriginal art-making. After preparing their bark, students had the exciting opportunity to choose their own designs. Many drew inspiration from traditional Aboriginal symbols and patterns, while others created contemporary interpretations that reflected their own connection to the land around our school. The finished artworks are truly spectacular, showcasing not only artistic talent but also cultural understanding and respect. Each piece tells its own story while honoring the rich traditions of Aboriginal bark painting.


