### VCE AG/HORT EXCURSION.



The VCE Ag & Hort students spent the morning at the BCG Main Site with BCG staff members, inspecting their trials and soil pit. BCG had held their main field day yesterday and the site was all set up, looking great. Meg Conlan, Amy McEachern, Zoe Wilson and Ben Eddleston discussed what they are investigating in several of their trials such as a different herbicide knockdown treatments, pre-emergent treatments, national variety trials, and nitrogen fixation trial with vetch and peas. We also saw the new Bioscout spore trap technology that BCG are testing that captures septoria spores to determine the presence of the disease in the area. This trial seeks to understand how this technology can be practically integrated into existing disease management system.

According to Cooper and Archie, the soil pit was the highlight as they could clearly see the horizons, the sodic layer, differences in soil colour, the subsoil clay, calcium deposits, the rooting depth of the wheat, organic matter. Zoe also spoke about how boron can be toxic at depth in this area.

We thank BCG for giving us the opportunity to view their field day site and for the staff for taking the time to discuss their work and results with us. It was educational experience and was interesting to view the trials being replicated and randomised on a large scale.





# Head Lice

Remember that school holidays are a peak time for headlice to visit, when children come into close contact with others and when travelling for holidays and meeting new people.

Please remember to do a headlice check on your childs hair before returning to school next term. Headlice are very active critters and can move in at any time, they can lay over 50 eggs in the span of a week. Within 7-10 days these eggs hatch and new hatchlings are capable of laying eggs themselves within 16 days. So, you can see why regular checking is recommended, don't wait until you notice your child scratching their head (not all children will scratch) but if they are please investigate and stay vigilant. If you need help or want more information about detecting and treating headlice, please don't hesitate to contact Carol Elliott (secondary school nurse) at the

Headlice are out and about with our warmer weather and they have been seen in the past week.

Please check your children carefully as they are difficult to see to the naked eye and small nits can often be mistaken, as they are no bigger than a grain of sand in their infancy.

The best method of checking is to use the" conditioner comb through "

school.

- Apply a generous amount of conditioner to your childs dry hair and work it through the hair thoroughly coating all the hair on your childs' head.
- Then using a normal comb at first, comb through the hair, using a downward stroke. After each stroke wipe off the excess conditioner onto white paper towelling.
- Thoroughly inspect the paper towel after each wipe for signs of nits or eggs.
- After working over the entire head, change the comb to a fine headlice/nit comb and repeat the process using downward strokes through the hair, covering the whole head, wiping each comb stroke onto the paper towel.
- Inspect the paper towelling for any signs of lice or eggs, if you are unsure, of any specs, wipe onto a piece of sticky tape and cover with a second piece of tape sealing the item. And send them to school to Carol Elliot-school nurse, in an envelope.


