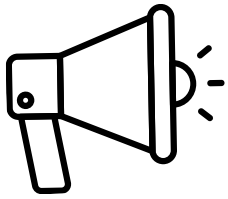

Dear Tyrrell College Community,

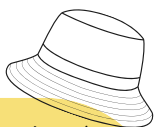
Highlight of the week, the Year 12 official, final days at school.

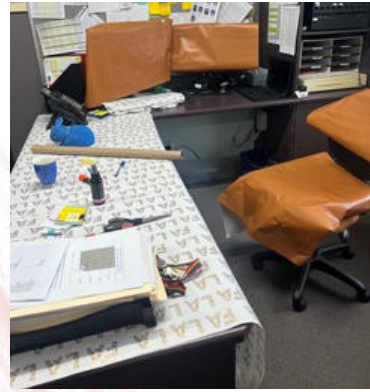
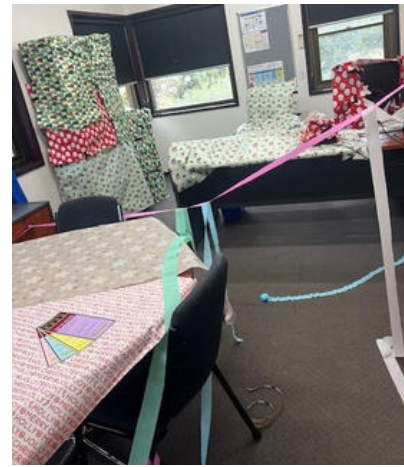

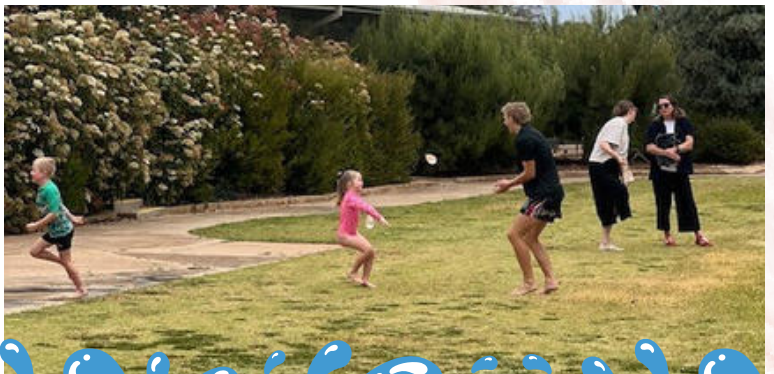

Talent at Tyrrell

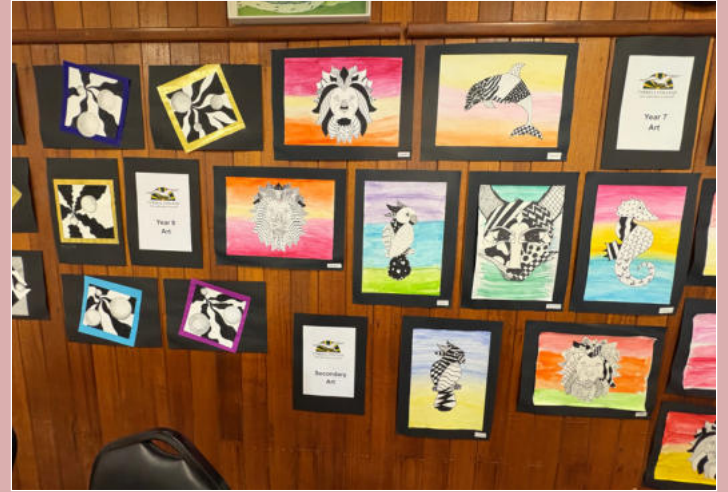
