YEAR 8 SCIENCE







This term, Year 8 students have started looking at Geology and rocks in Science. So far, students have learnt that minerals are the building blocks of rocks and that they must meet a set a 5 criteria in order to be considered a mineral. One of these criteria is that the minerals must have a fixed crystal structure.

Students have discovered that crystals form because it is the lowest energy requiring shape and that there are many different shapes that crystals can have. Some form cubes while others form rectangular prisms.

Students have grown their own crystal geode and observed crystals of different solutions growing under the microscope. Most recently they discovered that temperature effects the size a crystal grows too.

For the remainder of the term, students are comparing different rock types and learning how the environment in which they are in can change them into different rock types.

To help the online industry and the public to prepare for the <u>Social Media Minimum Age obligation</u>, eSafety has considered whether certain services are likely to be 'age-restricted social media platforms' and are therefore required to take reasonable steps to prevent Australians under 16 from having social media accounts from 10 December 2025. Earlier today, we announced an update to the <u>list of services</u> that, in eSafety's view, we consider will be age-restricted social media platforms. These platforms include:

- Facebook
- Instagram
- Kick
- Reddit
- Snapchat
- Threads
- TikTok
- . X
- YouTube.

We also announced an update to the list of services that, in eSafety's view, we consider will not be age-restricted social media platforms on the basis they do not currently meet the criteria for 'age-restricted social media platform'. These platforms include:

- Discord
 - GitHub
- Google Classroom
- LEGO Play
- Messenger
- Roblox
- Steam and Steam Chat
- WhatsApp
- YouTube Kids.

From 10 December, eSafety expects all age-restricted platforms to take <u>reasonable steps</u> to prevent Australian children under the age of 16 from having accounts. Any age restricted platforms which fail to do so may face enforcement action, including civil penalties of up to \$49.5 million

Technology changes quickly, so eSafety won't publish a fixed list of age-restricted companies. Instead, eSafety will regularly share <u>updated quidance on its website</u> about how it assesses services and enforces compliance. When new platforms appear or the sole, primary or significant purpose of existing ones change significantly, they may be assessed again.

No online platform or service is risk-free, especially for children. Young people can still be exposed to harmful conduct such as cyberbullying and being asked to share nudes, and to content that's inappropriate for their age like pornography and violent material.

Webinars for parents and carers, and educators and youth-service professionals are scheduled throughout November and December 2025.


