Last week, VCE Ag & Hort students were given the opportunity to climb aboard two impressive harvesters in the area: the New Holland CRIO and the John Deere X9. As part of their study into new and emerging innovations and technology, students spent the day riding in the headers, querying the operators and seeing first hand how technology is transforming modern cropping. They saw how new technology can improve: efficiency (more hectares harvested each day), sustainability (less fuel, fewer losses, etc), profitability (higher grain quality and lower operating costs) and workplace safety and comfort. Thank you to these farmers who shared their time, expertise and equipment to provide this hands-on experience, allowing students to connect classroom learning with real-world machinery.
