

VCE Ag & Hort

Innovations and Technology Unit

On Wednesday, our VCE Agriculture & Horticulture students travelled to the Tatura SmartFarm as part of their Innovations and Technology unit.

Tatura SmartFarm is one of Victoria's leading agricultural research hubs, where new technologies are developed, tested and demonstrated under real production conditions. It plays a vital role in helping farmers respond to challenges such as climate change, food security and food waste by translating cutting-edge research into practical industry solutions.

Throughout the day, students heard from expert guest speakers and explored a wide range of innovations currently being trialled. They were introduced to the principles of Integrated Pest Management (IPM), including how biological controls are used to reduce chemical reliance while maintaining productivity.

Out in the orchard, students observed:

- The orchard "sun dial" direction trial
- Narrow versus wider row spacing comparisons
- Agrovoltaics – solar panels positioned above fruit trees for dual land use
- Water sensor and drip irrigation technology
- Digital mapping and data collection systems
- Isochill cold storage technology, which reduces oxygen levels to extend shelf life and minimise food waste

While the robotic harvester was unfortunately away on the day, there was still plenty of innovation in action!

It was a full and valuable learning experience, with Archie, Cooper and Nate gaining first-hand insights that will directly support their upcoming SAC. Seeing how research partnerships turn ideas into real-world solutions gave students a deeper understanding of how innovation drives environmental, economic and social sustainability in Australia's food and fibre industries.

A big thank you to the team at Tatura SmartFarm for hosting us and sharing their expertise.



